Rockport-Fulton ISD set to vote on tax rate

Rockport-Fulton ISD Superintendent Dr. Lesley Austin is urging the community to stay informed about the upcoming Voter-Approval Tax Rate Election (VATRE), which will determine whether the district can increase local funding to maintain quality instruction and programs amid rising costs and declining enrollment.

In a recent statement,

Dr. Austin outlined the district's financial landscape, comparing Rockport-Fulton ISD (RFISD) to peer districts and explaining how the proposed tax rate would affect students, staff, and residents.

"The cost of educating students continues to rise, while our revenue has not kept pace," Austin said. "The VATRE allows our community to choose to invest additional local funds in our Maintenance & Operations, which directly supports teachers,



programs, and daily school operations."

Understanding the numbers

According to district data, RFISD's total proposed Maintenance & Operations (M&O) and Interest & Sinking (I&S) revenue for 2025–26 is \$14,243 per student, compared to the peer district average of \$16,907.

However, when examining M&O spending only, RFISD spends slightly more than its peers — \$13,279 per student versus \$13,184.

This difference, Austin said, is largely due to the district's coastal insurance costs, ongoing maintenance needs, and the absence of certain local revenue sources

that other districts have, such as major industry partnerships and additional voter-approved "enrichment pennies."

Many neighboring districts have also used bond programs to fund facility upgrades and technology improvements. RFISD has instead used its M&O funds for similar expenses — reducing the amount available for classroom instruction and staff support.

Community Faith in Focus

Rockport churches unite to raise funds for flood victims

n a coastal community still shaped by the memory of its own disaster, two neighboring churches are joining forces this month to throw a lifeline to another Texas region grappling with devastation.

Holy Cross Lutheran Church and St. Peter's Catholic Church will host their fifth annual Oktoberfest on Oct. 25, marking the first major collaboration since St. Peter's acquired the property next door. But this year, the lederhosen and lively polka music are in service of a solemn cause: raising funds for victims of recent catastrophic flooding in Kerrville

Catholic Vietnamese community prepares to consecrate new home

representation of the Vietnamese Catholic congregation of St. Peter's in this coastal city has been a community in exile, worshiping in a rented warehouse since Hurricane Harvey destroyed their church.

Now, the long wait for a permanent home is nearly over.

"We are nearing completion," said Father Tran, the parish priest. "We'll be ready by Nov. 1."

The new St. Peter's, located at 2922 FM 1781, is a transformed space previously occupied by the Blue Holiness Lutheran Church. The Diocese of Corpus Christi helped acquire the property, ending a years-long search for a new home. The consecration and

GLO approves Restore Little Bay initiative project

ary Guillory, co-chair of the Restore Little
Bay initiative, recently presented an update on the Tier 1 project approved by the General Land Office (GLO) and the Clean Coast Texas program.



The project addresses ecological challenges in Little Bay caused by factors such as stormwater runoff carrying pesticides and fertilizers, as well as fresh water effluent dumping. Currently, the water in Little Bay turns over every 42 days. If engineering suggestions are followed, this turnover time could be reduced to 19 days, which is considered critical.

Current planned

actions include dredging the Leggitt and Blevins channels and shoring up two central rookeries used by birds like the Blue Heron to prevent erosion. A major project will involve cutting a new canal from the water body adjacent to the marina, across the road, and into

Little Bay to increase circulation.

The canal project is moving into the grant process with the GLO. The group, which includes participants from the city, navigation district, and county, is also focusing on public education

CEPR Act feasibility study moves forward

he Aransas County

Commissioners
Court recently
approved two
separate motions
related to the
Lamar Beach Road
feasibility study and
alternatives analysis
project, which is
funded by a \$500,000
Coastal Erosion

Planning and Response (CEPR) Act award.
The project is also categorized as a FEMA hazard mitigation and disaster recovery project.

Commissioners approved the acceptance of the \$500,000 Notice of Award and authorized the county judge to execute the necessary documents. The official contract from the GLO is expected in a few

weeks.

Separately, the court approved the bid tabulation and awarded the contract to Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. Stantec had achieved the highest score during the evaluation process. Due to a FEMA-provided period of performance ending May 22 of 2026, the county will immediately work to request an extension.

Rockport-Fulton fell to 16-14 overall and 1-5 in district play. No Rockport-Fulton individual statistics from the match were reported.





National **Fire Prevention Month**

Every year the month of October is recognized as National Fire Prevention Month. The purpose of this month is to increase the awareness of home fire prevention. According to the National Fire Prevention Association, every 23 seconds a fire department in the United States responds to a fire somewhere in the nation. Along with this, unattended cooking is the number 1 cause of home fires. National Fire Prevention Month is important because it is a time to focus on education and preparedness to prevent house fires.

During National Fire Prevention Month, it is important to devise a plan in case of a fire. The National Fire Prevention Association reports that only 43% of homeowners have an escape plan. The American Red Cross provides the following tips to create an effective safety plan.

- Find two ways to get out of each room in the event the primary way is blocked by fire or smoke.
- Choose a safe meeting place a safe distance from your home.
- Practice getting low and moving to your exits in case there is smoke. • Ensure children know what a fire alarm sounds like and what actions should be taken in the event an alarm goes off.

• Make sure that windows are not stuck, screens can be taken out quickly and that security bars can be properly opened.

In addition to a functional safety plan, it is important to check the smoke alarms every month to ensure they are working properly. According to the National Fire Prevention Association, 3 of every 5 house fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with broken smoke alarms. When smoke alarms do not operate correctly, it is generally due to missing, disconnected or depleted batteries. Therefore, it is important to note smoke alarms should be replaced every 10 years from the manufacturer's date listed on the back of the alarm.

and the surrounding Hill Country.

"The theme is helping out the flood victims in Kerrville," said "Pastor Mike" Giese of Holy Cross Lutheran Church. "Communities helping communities is what we're all about here."

The sentiment is deeply personal in Rockport, a city that itself was ravaged by Hurricane Harvey in 2017. For years after the storm, St. Peter's predominantly Vietnamese Catholic congregation worshipped in a rented warehouse after their original church was condemned.

"When Hurricane Harvey went through, churches from all over... came together to aid Rockport and Fulton," Pastor Mike said. "Now it's our turn to help back."

The partnership between the two churches, one Lutheran and one Catholic, is a testament to a shared mission that transcends denomination.

"Working for a common cause, a good cause, can't hurt," Pastor Mike said. "It can only build community and be good."

The event, which runs from 11 a.m. to 2872 FM 1781, is designed to be a full-day, familyfriendly extravaganza. Attendees can browse a silent auction and arts and crafts sale, while children can enjoy hayrides, games, a cakewalk, and a bouncy house.

The main event, however, is a live auction at 2 p.m. featuring high-value items, including a golf cart and a grand prize of a seven-day safari for two to the Galapagos Islands.

The collaboration began taking shape just days after the Kerrville floods. Pastor Mike said his congregation quickly assembled and distributed "flood buckets," rakes, shovels, and personal care kits to volunteer fire departments in the smaller, outlying communities around Kerrville that

were receiving less immediate aid.

For the pastor, a Minnesota transplant who fulfilled a decades-long dream to live on the Gulf Coast, the event embodies a core tenet of his ministry: knowing and serving the community's needs.

"It's not if another hurricane's going to happen, it's when," he said, emphasizing the importance of organized disaster preparedness. "To be prepared and to think forward as to the needs of the community... that's whatever we can do to be helpful."

The Oktoberfest celebration promises a day of fun, but its ultimate goal is grounded in the hard-earned wisdom of a community that knows what it means to need a neighbor.

"What better service of a church to the community than providing an Oktoberfest or some kind of event that everyone can come together and have a good time?" Pastor Mike said. "That's what we're about, is having a good time with the community."

The VATRE's local impact

If voters approve the VATRE, the measure would add two cents to the district's tax rate and generate an estimated \$960,000 annually, or about \$336 per student, all of which would stay within the district and not be subject to state recapture.

"This election allows our community to decide what level of funding our schools should receive," Austin said. "These funds would help us retain high-quality teachers and sustain enrichment programs that support student growth."

Austin also noted that the proposed tax change will not affect residents over 65 years old who have claimed the state's homestead exemption. Their school district tax amount is legally capped under Texas Tax Code §11.26.

A community conversation

The superintendent emphasized that the VATRE is about local decision-making and continued investment in the district's students and staff. While financial resources alone do not guarantee improved academic ratings, Austin said targeted investments do.

"Money alone does not raise academic performance, but strategic investment does," she said. "It's about maintaining strong instruction, supporting teachers, and providing the tools our students need to succeed."

She encouraged residents to focus on the broader impact of education on the local community, noting that RFISD graduates will become the future workforce and leaders of Rockport-Fulton.

"Public schools serve the majority of our community's children," Austin said. "They will grow up to serve all of us."

Voting information

Early voting for the VATRE began Oct. 20, with Election Day set for Nov. 4.

Residents are encouraged to learn more about the proposal and participate in the decision that will shape the district's financial future.

The event marks a significant milestone, not just for the parish, but for Rockport's vibrant Vietnamese community, which is celebrating 50 years in the area this year. "They came with nothing but their faith," Father Tran said of the first arrivals who fled after the fall of South Vietnam in 1975.

Many were fishermen from a coastal region, and they found a familiar landscape and a new livelihood in the Texas Gulf Coast. In a poignant coincidence, Father Tran noted the name 'Rockport" translates directly to "B?n Đá" in Vietnamese, which means "port of rock." "It was God's will," he said.

The new church is more than just a building; it's a cultural anchor. For older generations who may not be fluent in English, it provides a vital space to worship in their heart language. For their children and grandchildren, it's a link to their heritage.

"It's a safe space where they can use the language, the culture, the way of life that they know," Father Tran said. "It's important to have a place where... they have a refuge."

The vision for the property extends beyond Sunday services. Father Tran described plans for a peaceful garden park on the grounds, complete with shaded seating and Stations of the Cross, inviting anyone to come for quiet reflection.

"I wish it were a place where people

can conceive it as their home," he said. "A home for anybody, everybody." The church's location next to an existing Lutheran congregation is also a symbol of a broader community spirit. Father Tran sees the proximity as an opportunity for cooperation on common causes, from fundraising for disaster victims to simply being good neighbors. "Working for a common cause, a good cause, can't hurt," he said. "It can only build community and be good."

The entire community is invited to the consecration ceremony on Nov. 1. For the congregation of St. Peter's, it will be the end of a long journey and the beginning of a new chapter, a testament to resilience, faith, and finally coming home.

to encourage residents to adopt simple habits like rainwater collection and organic fertilizers to minimize pollutants.

The ultimate long-term goal is to help the city replace its wastewater treatment plant

or construct a regional plant using reverse osmosis to remove contaminants like microplastics, pharmaceuticals, and forever chemicals. The initiative is forming a 501(c)(3) nonprofit to raise matching funds required for grants.

A hobby and passion becomes a business and labor of love

was walking around the various booths and vendors that fill the area around the **Fulton Convention** Center as Babes on the Bay was gearing up for their captain's meeting. Excited to compete in the artificial only division again - I was perusing various lures on display when one booth caught my eye. Up front, with multiple variations available, was the beloved spoon that is my go-to confidence lure in chasing redfish across the flats. As I was admiring the different weights, hammered styles, weedless option and with a red eye, Travis Meier walked over and introduced himself. After a few minutes of trying to connect where I knew him from, it hit me! We had communicated before about a large lady fish (skipjack) he had caught and I wrote about as the "Poor Man's Tarpon" the previous October. His picture was used for that week's column. Once our mutual "how do I know you" fugue dispersed, the serious business of lure selection began. I purchased several

throw. Those baits and

colors were doing so

of his spoons; he wished me luck, and the next day I caught three of the top four of our team's redfish submitted for measurement using the gold, hammered, weedless red eye spoon, and we placed 4th for the tournament.

Being the curious

type, I recently

reached out to him about Flatwater Baits - the brand behind my go to lure. Travis Meier and his wife Jackie are the work behind the magic of these lures, and established Flatwater Baits during a time many didn't know what to do. I asked him how it all started, and this was his reply: "Flatwater Baits began in my 6' x12' little storage shed on our property. I started playing around making soft plastics in 2020 during Covid. I couldn't travel for work like I normally would so I started playing around with some molds and pouring plastics in colors I wanted to

well for me on the flats with redfish, trout and flounder that I started handing them out to friends, family members and guides to fish along the Texas Coast. Those people started coming back to me wanting to buy more of the soft plastic lures or asking me to make certain colors. We started with a shad paddle tail in a few colors and that expanded into shrimp, then darts, a thumper paddle tail and now added our Mad Crab on a standup jig. In 2021, I started painting hard baits like top waters, and wake baits that worked in our local waters around Rockport. Also, in 2021, we came up with our logo and name, Flatwater Baits, as we fish bays and back lakes most of the time. We started doing fishing shows, tournaments and events around the Coastal Bend showcasing our products in 2022. We found out in 2023 that Bagley Lures was

no longer making their beloved gold spoons. Flatwater Baits was receiving a ton of requests to see if we could make something similar but with a twist ... a rattle. After a year of research and development and locating resources for the gold dipping process we finally have our spoons on the market. Our "Get Hammered" gold spoons are weedless, have a UV eye and a glass rattle. Along the way in our baitmaking, my wife, Jackie, was tired of our truck "smelling like sweat, fish and old Whataburger". That's when we came up with a line of air fresheners that hang from the rearview mirror. We knew that we needed

our air fresheners to

be masculine for our male anglers, so we decided on scents like leather, teakwood, and new-car smell among others; and in shapes of redfish, redfish tails and trout. Little did we know that these would be some of our bestsellers! This summer, we expanded from our little 6' x 12' storage shed to a new, larger, free-standing building which allowed us to really ramped up our production and ease our process. Around this time, Jackie left her main job as a pre-K teacher and made baitmaking her full time job to keep up with demand, production and shipping. Currently, we offer 180 different SKUs, and our products are available

in most of the local

tackle shops along the Texas Coast and a few in Louisiana, Florida, and the Carolinas. This journey that started off as a hobby out of boredom from being cooped up due to COVID-19 has really become a passion project. We love and are truly blessed by our loyal customers."

Out of adversity, paired with a passion and nonstop work ethic, an excellent business bloomed and found a foothold in the angler community. In Rockport, these lures can be found at Tackle Town, and Flatwater Baits can also be found on Facebook and online at https:// www.flatwaterbaits. com. Travis and his wife are both avid anglers, super friendly and a joy to discuss fishing with. If you see their booth at a show, stop in and visit - Travis might even share some updated fishing reports as he is in frequent communication with local guides and beta testing new lures and he gets out on the water as often as he can. I personally can vouch for that hammered gold, weedless spoon. The proof was in the fish!

A crisis of literacy: Why America can't read its way forward

The September
10-16 edition
of The Epoch Times
featured a chilling
column on America's
reading crisis – one
that demands urgent,
unflinching attention.
Drawing heavily from its
insights, the stark facts
reveal a nation adrift in
illiteracy, where reading
proficiency falters at
nearly every level.

Consider this: A recent high school honors graduate in Hartford, Connecticut, couldn't read her own diploma. She couldn't write, either. In 24 Illinois public schools, zero students read at grade level. Across the U.S., 54% of the population reads at or below a sixth-grade

level, while just 46% of adults have achieved even middle-school literacy mastery – let alone high school or college proficiency.

The official U.S. literacy rate of 99% is a cruel mirage. It measures only basic skills, equivalent to a K-3rd grade level - wholly inadequate for thriving in a world saturated with complex texts, from contracts to news feeds. In reality, about 21% of U.S. adults are functionally illiterate: They struggle to decipher instructions, fill out forms, or navigate essentials like job applications, Medicaid claims, or Social Security paperwork. This isn't just a statistic; it's a barrier to

dignity, opportunity, and independence.

From my recent attendance at State of the District addresses across our local schools and candid chats with administrators, the picture is mixed: Some districts shine comparatively, others lag perilously. Yet one refrain echoes through every meeting and conversation: the "whole student" approach, emphasizing socialemotional growth as a buffer to pure academics.

I respect that holistic view, but I must challenge it. Without rock-solid foundations in reading, writing, and arithmetic, the "whole student" is incomplete – doomed to a future riddled with unfillable voids. Emotional wellbeing can't compensate for the inability to decode a ballot, a prescription label, or a lease agreement.

Texas public education has taken one bold,

overdue step forward: banning mobile devices in classrooms. How we ever permitted these digital distractions to hijack young minds defies common sense. Screens fragment attention, erode focus, and widen the literacy gap. They also crush many person-to-person engagements creating socially awkward young people, who are the future of our country.

In Bee County, the County Judge, Trace Morrill referring to the county funding of the local library said: "It's a dying thing and it's absurd that it is dying. There is very little that is as important to a community as

the knowledge and experience that can be gained from opening a book." The Bee County Joe Barnhart Library is filled with great books, waiting.

The fix starts simple and sequential: First comes reading, the gateway to knowledge. Then writing, to articulate and persuade. Finally, arithmetic, to quantify and reason. Master these, and the rest follows. Ignore them, and we risk a generation lost in translation. It's time to reclaim the basics not as nostalgia, but as the unbreakable spine of progress. Our kids, our economy, and our democracy depend on it.

They are a stark reminder of the lasting damage a severe drought can create.

While we have water in town, stage 4 water restrictions limit what can be used for our trees. Take advantage of when you bathe by placing a bucket in the shower to catch water for your trees. This will help keep them from being stressed and won't violate water restrictions. Stressed trees are more susceptible to disease and insects.

Don't fertilize trees during a drought. It is important to allow them to slow down on growth and respiration rate to compensate for the lack of moisture. Don't prune during a drought. Pruning reduces a tree's ability to make food and transport water to survive.

Needless to say, you shouldn't plant a tree during a severe drought. Last year, Beeville Garden Club had the opportunity to work with the Forrest Service giving away free trees to the public. With the severity of the drought, the club passed on the free tree event this year.



Native plants have provided a bright spot in the garden. They survive on minimal water and provide food for wildlife and beautiful flowers to attract pollinators. Integrating native plants instead of exotics not only benefits wildlife; these plants can cope more efficiently with drought and high heat. Native plants are species that have evolved over tens of thousands of years. They have adapted to the local climate, to the soil and the precipitation. Most important, wildlife has evolved along with these plants and relies upon them as their primary source of

In a drought, we gardeners need to provide wildlife with water, shelter and places to raise their young. Native plants provide three out of four of these needs. Native plants provide seeds, nuts, fruits, berries and browse. In addition, native plants may have nectar, sap or pollen. Native plants support more insects than exotics and insects are important to the natural order. Insects are an important food source for birds, amphibians and other

It is important to provide shelter for wildlife to protect them from the extremes of temperature and to hide them from predators. Some of the same native plants that provide food can provide shelter.

Drought makes you

appreciate the need for water. Water provides a place for the critters to get a drink, bathe and provide habitat for frogs, dragonflies, toads and some salamanders.


If you are going to provide habitat for the critters, please don't use pesticides and limit fertilizers that run off into the local waterways.

One of my favorite natives is the Violet Ruellia (Ruellia nudiflora), a member of the Acanthus family. This charming wildflower can be found across most of the state, growing in heavier sands, clays and deep calcareous soils. Commonly known as wild petunia, the plant's charming purple to lavender flowers are produced during the summer in loose clusters on erect to recliningascending stems rising from grey green obovate leaves. The plant produces smaller clusters of non-opening, self-fertilizing (cleistogamous) flowers in the spring.

The charming wildflower is a member of the genus Ruellia named in honor of Jean Ruel, an early French herbalist.

Another wildflower that's not only surviving the drought but flourishing is Sawtooth Frog-Fruit. It is a member of the verbenacea family.

The plant has a prostrate, trailing, mat-forming growth habit. The leaves are lanceolate and have margins with teeth on the

upper three-quarters of the blade. The blooms appear on cylindrical spikes on long peduncles rising from the leaf axils of the plant. The tiny white flowers have five petals with a rose tint and a yellow center. Sawtooth Frog-Fruit has small nut-like, dry fruit.

The plant will grow in various soils on prairies, openings, waste places and along roads in the Rio Grande Plains and Coastal Prairies. Wildlife, such as white-tailed deer, javelinas and feral hogs eat the leaves.

Barbados Cherry (Malpighia glabra) is a charming native shrub native to South Texas, South America and the West Indies. It is normally 1½-2½ feet wide and 3-4 feet tall but can reach 9 feet with optimum conditions. Barbados Cherry can serve as an understory bush, thriving in dappled shade to part shade but also thrives in full sun. It isn't fussy about soil adapting to sand, loam, or clay as long as it doesn't have wet feet.

Barbados Cherry is a fast-growing shrub with rich glossy green oblong

leaves. The shrub is covered in pink and white blooms from spring to early fall. The blooms are followed by tiny red fruit resembling cherries - a favorite of birds. The fruit is high in vitamin C, fragrant, and sweet making it excellent in jelly.

The evergreen

shrub can be used as a topiary or a hedge. If allowed, the shrub can grow into a large, soft accent shrub. There is a dwarf selection that reaches 2 feet making it a great container plant. If grown in areas that have temperatures fall in the 20s on a regular basis keep the shrub in a container and bring it inside

Add a few of these native plants and welcome wildlife to your garden while conserving water.
